Notes:

1. Camden students must pass the HIM department's Computer Competency Exam before being admitted to the program to meet the CIS 1055 requirement. Once students successfully complete the exam, Temple University academic advisor will post "Requirement Complete" DARS exception
2. It is recommended that students work with their Camden transfer counselor to select courses for the 45+ Gen Ed for their Camden electives. Students choosing other electives may need additional courses at Temple to complete the 45+ Gen Ed requirements. Transfer credits with Core designations will satisfy General Education requirements. However, students cannot use the same course to fulfill a General Education and a major or minor requirement. Transfer courses with Core designations will be applied to major requirements first and then to GenEd.
3. CCC combination of HIT 130 & HIT 215 will fulfill Temple's HIM 4105: Current Procedural Terminology if taught in ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS. These major requirements will be posted through DARS exception. Students transferring without the combination of HIT 130 and HIT 215 or taught in ICD-9-CM may need additional semesters at Temple to complete their degree.
4. CCC combination of HIT 140 & HIT 240 will fulfill Temple's HIM 3208: International Classification of Disease if taught in ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS. These major requirements will be posted through DARS exception. Students transferring without the combination of HIT 140 and HIT 240 or taught in ICD-9-CM may need additional semesters at Temple to complete their degree.
5. CCC combination of HIT 130 & HIT 215 & HIT 140 & HIT 240 will fulfill Temple's HIM 4206: Intermediate Coding if taught in ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS. These major requirements will be posted through DARS exception. Students transferring without the combination of HIT 130, HIT 215, HIT 140 and HIT 240 or taught in ICD-9-CM may need additional semesters at Temple to complete their degree.
6. HPM 2214: Politics and Payment in US Healthcare System and HIM 2215: Health Care Information Management IT Fundamentals must be completed at Temple during a summer semester before students are accepted into the HIM Program at Temple. Alternatively, students can complete these courses through Temple's Office of Continuing Studies during the fall or spring semester prior to beginning the HIM program. A grade of C or better is required for all HIM prerequisite and professional courses.

Undergraduate students and their advisors use the Degree Audit Reporting System to plan and track a student's academic career at Temple. DARS works in concert with our Banner Student information system to show how a student's course work to date, including transferred courses, will fulfill the academic requirements necessary to complete a degree in the major field of study

- 1) CCC combination of HIT 130 & HIT 215 is equivalent to Temple's HIM 4105: Current Procedural Terminology CPT Coding, if taught in IDC-10-CM and IDC-10-PCS.
- 2) CCC combination of HIT 140 & HIT 240 is equivalent to Temple's HIM 3208: International Classification of Disease, if taught in IDC-10-CM and IDC-10-PCS.
- 3) CCC combination of HIT 140 & HIT 240 & HIT 215 is equivalent to Temple's HIM 4206: Intermediate Coding, if taught in IDC-10-CM and IDC-10-PCS.
- 4) Once students successfully complete HIM department's Computer Competency Exam, Temple University academic advisor will post "Requirement Complete" DARS exception for CIS 1055.

If the suggested classes are successfully completed and an Associate in Applied Science for Health Information Technology is awarded from CCC, the remaining requirements for the **BS in Health Information Management** are as follows:
