**Notes:**

- 1) Students who transfer with the Associate of Arts in Sport Management from Bucks will require certification that a QA/QB level mathematics course has been completed prior to transfer in order to be classified as GenEd-to-GenEd. Students who transfer without a QA/QB level mathematics course will be required to complete Temple's 45+ General Education curriculum and will require additional time to graduation.

- 3) Students who complete a 180 hour internship may apply for transfer credit through submission of a portfolio. If the 180 hours are completed, a grade of C- or higher earned in the course, and a sufficient portfolio is submitted, students may receive credit for STHM 3185 Internship I.
- 4) Students who transfer in fewer than 62 credits would need to take an additional class at Temple to reach the 124 credits required for the degree.

If the suggested classes are successfully completed at Bucks County Community College and an Associate of Arts in Sport Management degree is awarded, the remaining four semesters for the **Bachelor of Science in Sport and Recreation Management** are as follows:

- b) Students following this program-to-program agreement are not eligible to declare a Concentration as part of the 12-credit Major Management Electives requirement.



- c) If students select the 6-credit option of STHM 4185, then they must select an additional six credits of major electives at the 3000 level or above or repeat STHM 4185 for an additional six credits (CSS and CSPD permission required).
