**Notes:**

- 1) It is strongly recommended that students take ACC 104: Financial Accounting, ECO 101: Macroeconomics, MKT 101: Principles of Marketing and MGT 102: Intro to Management at CCC to satisfy the STHM Major Business Elective requirements. Students transferring without these courses may need additional semesters at Temple to complete their degree.
- 2) Temple's School of Tourism & Hospitality will waive STHM 3185: Internship I through DARS exception, for students who transfer HPE 209: Internship Sport Management. To be considered for waiver the following must be present
  - a. Total hours worked on-site during the practicum meet 180 documented hours.
  - b. The student received an official letter that includes a detailed internship duties description while at CCC.
  - c. The student, in collaboration with the site supervisor, advisors, and/or faculty supervisor, created a portfolio of the experience that includes a detailed description of duties performed, student self-evaluations, and periodic reflections on the overall experience. (Student provides portfolio to Temple's STHM for review.)
  - d. The student received evaluations from the site supervisor on the quality of work performed

Students who complete A.S. in Sport Management at CCC are included in the Camden-Temple GenEd-to-GenEd Transfer Agreement, and therefore, have satisfied all the GenEd requirements at Temple. Students should consult with their Camden academic advisor to select appropriate courses for the Associates in Sports Management degree.
- 3) If not completed at CCC, students will still be able to complete free elective as part of their degree at Temple.

If the suggested classes are successfully completed and an Associate in Science in Sport Management is awarded from Camden County College, the remaining four semesters in the Sport & Recreation Management follows:

### DARS EXCEPTIONS TO BE ENTERED BY TEMPLE ACADEMIC ADVISOR

Undergraduate students and their advisors use the Degree Audit Reporting System to plan and track a student's academic career at Temple. DARS works in concert with our Banner Student information system to show how a student's course work to date, including transferred courses, will fulfill the academic requirements necessary to complete a degree in the major field of study

For the DARS exceptions to be processed, students should bring a copy of the articulation agreement and a copy of their final Camden Community College transcript to their first advising appointment with their Temple Academic Advisor. The final transcript must show the degree awarded and a conferral date. Official copy of the final transcript must be sent to the Temple Admissions Office.

**General Degree Notes:**

- I. The degree minimum requirement is 124 s.h. Assuming no remedial or repeat coursework is required the student completes the remaining coursework listed above at Temple.
- II. The student completing the Camden and Temple courses and requirements specified on pages 4 and 5 of this agreement will meet all requirements for graduation with the Bachelors of Science in Tourism & Hospitality Management.
- III. Students are encouraged to declare a concentration. Declaring a concentration is optional; completing 12 credits of major electives is required. Students should consult their Temple Academic Advisor when selecting major electives.
- IV. All Temple students are required to take two Writing Intensive (WI) courses at Temple University in addition to completing the GenEd requirements. Writing Intensive courses in transfer cannot be used to fulfill this school/college requirement.
