**Notes:** *The B.A. in Psychology in the College of Liberal Arts at Temple University consists of 44-45 credits in the major, including 4 credits in a designated science area. Per the CLA Residency Requirement, students must complete at least half of the courses at Temple*

- 1) Students who transfer to Temple with an Associate of Science in Psychology have satisfied the terms of the Temple-DCCC GenEd-to-GenEd transfer agreement and have completed the General Education requirements necessary to graduate from Temple University.
- 2) MAT 210: Statistics transfers to Temple as MATH 1013: Elements of Statistics. Temple's MATH 1013: Elements of Statistics satisfies the major requirement PSY 1004: Critical Thinking in Psychology through a DARS exception. Students transferring without this course may require additional time to degree completion.
- 3) PSY 210: Lifespan Human Development, PSY 220: Abnormal Psychology, and PSY 255: Intro to Biological Psychology are core course options for the A.S. in Psychology degree at DCCC. Students must choose two courses from the list to successfully complete the six credits of Psychology Core courses to earn the A.S. in Psychology degree. All three courses satisfy major requirements in the B.S. in Psychology program. PSY 210: Lifespan Human Development transfers to Temple as PSY 2301: Foundations of Developmental Psychology and PSY 220: Abnormal Psychology transfers to Temple as PSY 2201: Foundations of Psychopathology. Both courses satisfy the Developmental, Clinical, Social (DCS) Foundations course requirements for the B.A. in Psychology degree at Temple. PSY 255: Intro to Biological Psychology transfers to Temple as PSY 2501: Foundations of Behavioral Neuroscience and satisfies one of the Brain and Cognitive Science Foundation courses in the B.A. in Psychology degree at Temple. Course selections at DCCC will determine which two foundation courses will need to be completed at Temple.
- 4) The College of Liberal Arts at Temple University requires all students to complete at least two levels of a foreign language. It is strongly recommended that students select a 101 level foreign language course at DCCC to partially fulfill this requirement. Students transferring without a 101 level foreign language course may require additional time to degree completion.
- 5) The College of Liberal Arts at Temple University requires all students to complete at least two levels of a foreign language. It is strongly recommended that students select a 102 level foreign language course at DCCC to partially fulfill this requirement. Students transferring without a 102 level foreign language course may require additional time to degree completion.

- Course selections at DCC will determine which two foundation courses will need to be complete at Temple. The B.A. in Psychology requires students to complete two DCS and two BCS Area Foundation course. Student should consult with an advisor.
- Students should select a course that satisfies the CLA Foreign Language/Global Studies requirement. Students who completed two levels of a foreign language at their community college should select one of the following: a third semester of foreign language; take one Global Studies course; study abroad at an approved program; or take a GenEd Global/World Society course.
- To earn a CLA baccalaureate degree, a student must complete a minimum of 123 credits, including: 90 credits in CLA/CST courses, 45 credits of which must be at the upper level (numbered 2000-4999). Of that, 6 credits must be outside the student's major division (e.g. Social Sciences or Humanities)
- Students have the option to choose one of three capstone courses including: PSY 4596: Capstone: Fields of Psychology, PSY 4696: Capstone in Psychology, or PSY 4996: Honors Capstone. Student should consult with an advisor.
- Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete 45 hours of the last 60 hours of the degree or program as matriculated students at Temple University. If a matriculated student previously took Temple courses on a non-matriculated basis, those courses are counted towards this requirement.
- Per Temple's Transfer Policy for [Permission to Complete a Course at Another Institution after Matriculation](#), students who transfer 60 credits or more cannot receive permissions to transfer additional course work
