Notes:

- 1) Students who earn an A.A. in Social Services from Harrisburg Area Community College will be required to complete Temple's General Education 45+ curriculum. This includes taking courses in the areas of: Intellectual Heritage I (GY): The Good Life, Race and Diversity (GD), World Society (GG), Quantitative Literacy (GQ), and Science and Technology (GS), and two of the following: Arts (GA), Human Behavior (GB), and U.S. Society (GU). Temple has made recommendations for your course selection at HACC so that your transfer courses will satisfy these requirements prior to your transfer to Temple. Students who do not follow these recommendations will require additional time to degree completion.
- 2) Students should select the first level of any language. The College of Liberal Arts at Temple University requires that all students complete at least two levels of a foreign language. A 101-level foreign language course at HACC will satisfy the first level of this requirement. Students who place into a 200-level foreign language may begin there.
- Students should select one of the following: ECO 201, ECO 202, GEO 230, or SOC 201. These courses transfer to Temple and satisfy the General Education Human Behavior (GB) requirement. Students transferring without these courses may require additional time to degree completion.
- 4) Students should select a math course equivalent to Temple's QA/QB level (HACC's MAT 103, MAT 104, MAT 110, 111, 119, 121, 202 or higher). These courses will satisfy Temple's Quantitative Literacy (GQ) General Education requirement. Students transferring without one of these courses may require additional time to degree completion.
- 5) Students should select one of the following: ANT 101, ENG 217, HIS 108 or HIS 109. These courses transfer to Temple and satisfy the General Education Race & Diversity (GD) requirement. Students transferring without one of these courses may require additional time to degree completion.
- 6) Students should select one of the following: GEO 201, HIS 103, or HIS 104. These courses transfer to Temple and satisfy the General Education U.S. Society (GU) requirement. Students transferring without one of these courses may require additional time to degree completion.
- 7) Students should select the second level of foreign language. The College of Liberal Arts at Temple University requires that all students complete at least two levels of a foreign language. A 102-level foreign language course at HACC will satisfy this requirement. Students who completes the second level of a foreign language at an earlier date are encouraged to take the third level of the language, if available.
- 8) Students should select ENG 217 or ENG 246. ENG 217 transfers to Temple as ENG 2401: African American Literature I. ENG 246 transfers to Temple as ENG 2221: Shakespeare. Both of these courses can be used to satisfy Part A of the two-course sequence required for students to get credit for Intellectual Heritage I: The Good Life (GY), a General Education requirement at Temple. Students transferring without one of these courses may require additional time to degree completion.
- 9) Students should select PHI 200. PHI 200 transfers to Temple as REL1101: Introduction to World Religions. This course can be used to satisfy Part B of the two-course sequence required for students to get credit for Intellectual Heritage I: The Good Life (GY), a General Education requirement at Temple. Students transferring without one of these courses may require additional time to degree completion.
- 10) Students should select a laboratory science course that fulfills Temple's Science & Technology (GS) General Education Requirement. Eligible courses include: AST104, BIO103, BIO111, BIO 112, BIO 121, BIO 212, BIO225, CHE101, CHE102, CHE121, END201, GEL101, GEL102, GEL201, GEO101, PHY201, PHY202, PHY211, PHY212. Students transferring without one of these courses may require additional time to degree completion.
- 11) Students should select a course that will transfer to Temple and fulfill the World Society (GG) General Education requirement. Students should select one of the following: ANT205, GEO201, GPO205, GPO208, HIS101, HIS102, HIS202, HIS210, HUM113, HUM114, HUM201, or PHI 200. Students transferring without one of these courses may require additional time to degree completion.

a) Student who transfer from HACC without all of Temple's recommended 45+ General Education requirements may require additional time and credits to satisfy their degree requirements for graduation.

b) Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete 45 hours of the last 60 hours of the degree or program as matriculated students at Temple University. If a matriculated student previously took Temple courses on a nonmatriculated basis, those courses are counted towards this requirement.

- c) To earn a CLA baccalaureate degree, a student must complete a minimum of 123 credits, including: 90 credits in CLA/CST courses, 45 credits of which must be at the upper level (numbered 2000-4999). Of that, 6 credits must be outside the student's major division (e.g., Social Sciences). (Transfer courses can be used to fulfill some of these requirements).
- d) The Social Science track of the Liberal Studies major requires five courses in one "Concentration" (e.g., Psychology or Criminal Justice), four upper level Social Science courses outside the Concentration, and four upper level Humanities courses. Up to eight HACC courses may transfer toward these requirements.
