Notes:

- 1) Recommend students select RS 103: World Religions. RS 103 transfers to Temple as REL 1101: World Religions. RS 103 will satisfy one of the CLA Foreign Language/Global Studies requirements at Temple. Students transferring without this course may have additional course work to complete for graduation.
- 2) Recommend students select MH 203: Statistics I. MH 203 transfers to Temple as STAT 2101: Statistical Methods and Concepts and will satisfy the major requirement of PSY 1004: Critical Thinking in Psychology. Students transferring without MH 203 will have to complete PSY 1004: Critical Thinking in Psychology at Temple University.

- 3) Recommend students select BI 101: Biology or CH 101: Fundamentals of Chemistry. BI 101 transfers to Temple as BIOL 1012: General Biology II and CH 101 transfers to Temple as CHEM 1031/1033 General Chemistry I and Laboratory I. BI 101 and CH 101 satisfy the laboratory science major requirement for the Psychology degree at Temple. Students transferring without one of these two courses will need to complete additional course work upon transfer to Temple to ensure graduation requirements have been met.
- 4) Recommend students select HS 102: History of Western Civilization. HS 102 transfers to Temple as HIST 1301: Modern Europe. Successful completion of HS 102 will satisfy one of the CLA Foreign Language/Global Studies requirements at Temple University.
- 5) Recommend students select one of the following Diversity/Global Awareness Core courses to ensure transferability to Temple: HS 102, HS 103, HS 104, HS 105, HS 111, or SO 101.

If students have not already successfully completed RS 103 or HS 102 during earlier semesters, it is strongly suggested that students select one of these courses.

*The Psychology major at Temple consists of 44 credits, including 40 credits in Psychology and 4 credits in a designated science area. Per the University's residency requirement, students must complete at least half of their major credits at Temple.

If the suggested classes are successfully completed and an Associate of Arts in Psychology is awarded from Manor College, the remaining four semesters for the **Bachelor of Arts in Psychology** are as follows:

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Students who have successfully completed MH 203: Statistics I at Manor College will have satisfied the requirements for PSY 1004: Critical Thinking in Psychology and do not need to take this course at Temple University. 2) To earn a CLA baccalaureate degree, a student must complete a minimum of 123 credits, including: 90 credits in CLA/CST courses, 45 credits of which must be at the upper level (numbered 2000-4999). Of that, six credits must be upper-level electives outside the student's major division (e.g. Humanities or Natural Sciences). 3) Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete 45 hours of the last 60 hours of the degree or program as matriculated students at Temple University.
