Notes:

1. Course satisfies a major requirement at Temple.
2. MAT 160 can be taken in place of MAT 130 and MAT 131 to fulfill the Fox requirement for Calculus and also fulfills the second semester core mathematics (QB) at Temple.
3. Students are recommended to take courses in the Fox School's Business Core as their Business Electives. DCCC courses that fulfill Fox School core requirements are BUS210, BUS230, BUS243 and INS100.
4. The Fox School will accept DCCC's DPR 100 to fulfill the required CIS 1055.
5. Students should choose COMM 111 – Public Speaking.
6. Students who complete the A.S. in Business Administration at DCCC are included in the DCCC-Temple Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement, and therefore, have satisfied all of the Core requirements at Temple except two writing intensive courses, which must be completed at Temple. Students not completing the A.S. in Business Administration should work with their DCCC Transfer Advisor to select courses to meet Core requirements at Temple.



**Graduation Requirements**

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The degree of Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) may be conferred upon a student by recommendation of the faculty and upon the satisfactory completion of a minimum of 123 semester hours of credit with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 overall and in the major. A minimum of 123 credit hours will be earned in the following four requirement categories:
