## Notes:

- 1. Students who transfer with the Associate of Arts in Social Services from HACC will require certification that a QA/QB level mathematics course has been completed prior to transfer in order to be classified as GenEd-to-GenEd. Students who transfer without a QA/QB level mathematics course will be required to complete Temple's 45+ General Education curriculum and will require additional time to graduation.
  - Either MAT 110: Applied Calculus for Business or MAT 202: Introduction to Statistics will satisfy the QA/QB level
    mathematics course requirement. Students who successfully complete either course will be classified as GenEd-toGenEd.
- 2. NT stands for Non-Transferable. Non-transferable courses will not transfer to Temple for credit.
- 3. It is strongly recommended that students select MAT 110: Applied Calculus for Business or MAT 202: Introduction to Statistics. MAT 110: Applied Calculus for Business transfers to Temple as STAT 1102: Calculus for Business and MAT 202: Introduction to Statistics transfers to Temple as STAT 2101: Statistical Methods and Concepts. Both courses satisfy the Bachelor of Social Work statistics major requirement. Students transferring without MAT 110 or MAT 202 may require additional time to degree completion.
- 4. It is strongly recommended that students select SOC 201: Introduction to Sociology. SOC 201: Introduction to Sociology transfers to Temple as SOC 1176: Intro to Sociology and satisfies a major requirement at Temple. Students transferring without SOC 201 may require additional time to degree completion.
- 5. HACC requires students to select either a Literature course (ENG 200-299) or one of the following foreign language courses: SPAN 101, SPAN 102, FRCH 101, FRCH 102, or GRMN 101 or GRMN 102. Student should consult Temple's Transfer Equivalency Tool to select a course that will transfer to Temple to fulfill an elective requirement.
- 6. HACC requires students to select an additional laboratory science elective from the following courses: ASTR 103, ASTR 104, BIOL 101, BIOL 108, CHEM 101, CHEM 113, or PHYS 201. Student should consult Temple's Transfer Equivalency Tool to select a course that will transfer to Temple to fulfill an elective requirement.
- 7. It is strongly recommended that students select ECO 201: Principles of Macroeconomics or ECO 202: Principles of Microeconomics. ECO 201: Principles of Macroeconomics transfers to Temple as ECON 1101: Macroeconomics Principles and ECO 202 Principles of Microeconomics transfers to Temple as ECON 1102: Microeconomic Principles. Either course, ECO 201 or ECO 202 will fulfill the economics requirement for this Bachelor of Social Work degree at Temple. Students transferring without one of these courses may require additional time to degree completion.
- 8. HACC requires students to select a Philosophy course. Student should consult Temple's Transfer Equivalency Tool to select a course that will transfer to Temple to fulfill an elective requirement.
- 9. It is strongly recommended that students select PSPL 101: Introduction to American Government. PSPL 101: Introduction to American Government transfers to Temple as POLS 1101: The American Political System and satisfies a major requirement at Temple. Student transferring without PSPL 101 may require additional time to degree completion.

- c) Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete 45 hours of the last 60 hours of the degree or program as matriculated students at Temple University. If a matriculated student previously took Temple courses on a non-matriculated basis, those courses are counted towards this requirement.
- d) Per Temple's Transfer Policy for <u>Permission to Complete a Course at Another Institution after Matriculation</u>, students who transfer 60 credits or more cannot receive permissions to transfer additional course work
