Notes:

1. Course satisfies a major requirement at Temple.
2. HACC will approve an exception to the required BUS 209 for transfer to the PASSHE institutions.
3. Students transferring the combination of MATH 103 and 110 satisfy the requirement for STAT 1001 and 1102.
4. HACC courses that can be taken to satisfy requirements for the BBA degree include: MGMT201 and MKTG201. It is recommended students select these courses for two of their transfer electives. Students selecting other courses may need additional semesters at Temple to complete the degree. Business courses not listed may not transfer due to AACSB accreditation restrictions. Study of a foreign language through the third semester level is recommended for students interested in International Business at Temple. MATH 122 and MATH 221 are recommended for students interested in Actuarial Science. Students should work with their Harrisburg Area Community College Transfer advisor to select remaining transfer electives.
5. Students must complete two writing intensive courses at Temple.
6. Students who complete the A.A. in Business Administration at HACC are included in the HACC-Temple GenEd-to-GenEd Transfer Agreement, and therefore, have satisfied all of their General Education requirements at Temple

Graduation Requirements

The degree of Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) may be conferred upon a student by recommendation of the faculty and upon the satisfactory completion of a minimum of 124 semester hours of credit with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 overall and in the major. A minimum of 124 credit hours will be earned in the following four requirement categories plus free electives if needed:

Any updates for each academic year are available each June with the publication of the Bulletin.

Twenty business courses (59 s.h.) are required as part of the lower- and upper-division foundation requirements for the B.B.A. program. In addition, a minimum of six business courses must be completed in the major. In completing the courses in the major, students will become competent in understanding critical business concepts and the practice of ethical decision-making, and demonstrate both effective written and oral communication and the ability to apply critical thinking to business problems. All Fox students must take a minimum of two writing-intensive courses. One of these courses will be Business Administration 2196; the second will be a writing-intensive capstone course in the major. The writing capstone is normally taken in the students' final semester.

NOTE: Many upper-division foundation courses and major courses have prerequisites and some of these prerequisites also include grade requirements. Students are required to meet all prerequisites. Prerequisites will be strictly enforced and the school reserves the right to de-enroll students from courses when prerequisites have not been met.
