- Course satisfies a major requirement at Temple.
- These electives could be filled by MAT 100 (only if indicated by Montgomery County Community College's Math placement test /prerequisite) and Business courses indicated below which transfer to Temple's Fox School of Business.  
 Fox School of Business courses that are required for the BBA degree and can be taken at Montgomery County Community College for transfer credit include: ACC 150, MGT 111, MGT 141, and MKT 111. Other Business courses that will transfer but are not required for the BBA degree include: ACC151, ACC211 (if completed between and including Fall 1996 and Fall 2009), ACC 212 (if completed between and including Fall 1996 and Spring 2009), and MGT110. Please note that ACC 211 and ACC 212 will no longer be transfer to Temple for the BBA degree starting in Fall 2010.
- It is highly recommended that students complete SPC 110 or SPC 120 to satisfy the Fox School of Business Speech Communication requirement.
- Fox School of Business and Management will waive CIS 1055(55) for students who transfer CIS 110.
- Students who complete the A.S. Degree in Business Administration at Montgomery County Community College are included in the Montgomery County Community College and Temple Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement, and therefore, have satisfied all of the Core requirements at Temple except two writing intensive courses, which must be completed at Temple.

### Graduation Requirements

#### Associate in Science Degree in Business Administration at Montgomery County Community College to Bachelor of Business Administration Degree at Temple Transfer Prior to Fall 2010 Update to the 2003 Agreement

The degree of Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) may be conferred upon a student by recommendation of the faculty and upon the satisfactory completion of a minimum of 123 semester hours of credit with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 overall and in the major. A minimum of 123 credit hours will be earned in the following four requirement categories:

**University Core Curriculum** – Requirement is fulfilled, except for two Writing-intensive courses to be taken at Temple, when student completes the Associate in Science Degree in Business Administration at Montgomery County Community College.

**Lower Division Foundation Requirements** – Many of the lower division foundation requirements listed below are completed when students follow the Fox School of Business and Montgomery County Community College Program-to-Program agreement outlined on page 4.
